This year's festival brought together powerful films, talented filmmakers, and inspiring audiences across Cinemapolis, college campuses, and virtual events. We're proud to share that **attendance doubled** from last year, marking our most successful festival yet.

Campus Screenings & Student Engagement

For the first time, we brought films directly to students, with campus screenings of *The Janes* at Cornell University and Ithaca College. Emmy Award-winning and Academy Award-nominated director **Tia Lessin** joined us in person for a post-screening conversation and Q&A—an inspiring and energizing experience for students.



Short Shorts Film Competition

We were thrilled to launch our 'Short Shorts Film Competition,' where winning films screened and filmmakers were celebrated with an awards ceremony.

Pop-Up Anti-Abortion Center Demonstration

This year's pop-up demonstrations outside the Finger Lakes Pregnancy Center were a major success. Participation surged, especially among local students from Ithaca College and the Lehman Alternative Community School, whose energy and commitment amplified the visibility and impact of the actions.



Organized by EAS interns Bella Phelps and Paige Currier, and EAS member Myra Kovary, the demonstrations energized both new and returning activists. As Myra shared in *The Ithacan*:

"I'm thrilled that young people are finding a way to be actively involved. I just love them. I love working with them. The enthusiasm, the creativity, the passion. It just warms my heart."

Seeing this growing engagement from younger generations is one of the most meaningful outcomes of this year's festival.

- Fly So Far followed by a powerful discussion with Sarah Jane Cushman and Sammie Werkheiser, two formerly incarcerated women dedicated to advocating for women still behind bars.
- Connie Cook: A Documentary followed by a post-screening conversation with
 Assemblywoman Anna Kelles, director Sue Perlgut, and Connie's daughter Cathy Cook,
 who inspired audiences by reflecting on how Assemblywoman Connie Cook's moral
 courage continues to shape their work and lives today.

No Choice — directed by Ithaca native Nate Hilgartner and filmed in Tompkins County.
 The screening received a standing ovation, followed by a lively discussion with the cast and crew.
